Shhhhhh! Or not. If you think of libraries only as silent study halls, you’ll be surprised by the way students learn today. The Herman B Wells Library, in particular, is a popular destination for students to meet classmates, practice presentations, or work on group projects. The Wells Library has a prized collection of books, of course—more than 4.5 million volumes—plus lots of information available online. Students especially like the Information Commons, which the editors of the student newspaper called a “one-stop, work-until-you-wilt megaplex of technology.” Stop in any time 24/7 to see how the IUB Libraries and University Information Technology Services have transformed information access, research and learning. Or, find a quiet place to study. The choice is yours.

Parents, when accompanied by their son or daughter who is enrolled in IUB, can *use the facilities for free this weekend*. Student ID is required by the student and photo ID required by the accompanying parent. Tour and work out at one of the country's leading campus recreational sports facilities. The 204,000 sq-ft Student Recreational Sports Center, built at a cost of \$22.5 million, has been one of the most active places on campus since it opened its doors in July 1995. SRSC highlights include the Counsilman/Billingsley Aquatic Center, three multi-sport gymnasiums, elevated running track and a strength and conditioning room equipped with over 400 pieces of cardiovascular and weight-training equipment. At the School of Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building, explore

the historic Wildermuth Gymnasium, visit the Royer Pool where legendary Olympic champion Mark Spitz trained, or take a walk around Woodlawn Field and the sprawling tennis courts. Siblings can purchase a day pass. Age policies apply.
